Meetings Since our last newsletter we have had two very successful meetings, both attracting very large audiences, members and visitors. In January Judy Faraday, archivist for the John Lewis Partnership gave us an excellent insight into the history and unique structure of the Partnership and our local Waitrose, tracing it from the small beginnings to the vast concern it is today. In February many turned out to hear Bob Clark, until recently the owner of Birtchnell's, give a talk entitled 'Small Man Beorcham,' telling us of his very special memories of Percy Birtchnell, a founder member of our Society and a remarkable man. A special point of interest was added by the tragic collapse of the building only two weeks previously. Bob also showed us some of the many photographs Percy had taken, some of which he needed help in identifying. In March following the AGM Ned Hunt, a Society member, will be telling us of 'The Tring Hundred, its Boundaries and Berkhamsted', another opportunity to widen our knowledge of Berkhamsted's history.

Foundling Voices Project You will have heard this mentioned often in the last two years. The project is now almost complete. Memories of a large number of former foundlings have been recorded. Some former Ashlyns Pupils have also contributed their

memories. The specially-commissioned play has been performed in Redhill and in London. It is hoped that Ashlyns pupils will perform it next year. It is also hoped there will be an audio trail ready before long for Ashlyns School to use for school Open

Heritage Open Days Plans for the HODs are already underway. We are hoping to include the British Film Institute archive at Kingshill this year, but it is not proving very straightforward. If there are any other suggestions for inclusion in our programme or suggestions for improvement please do let me know.

<u>Percy Birtchnell Memorial Prize</u> Year 4 children will be working this year on the topic of 'Heroes', choosing someone who is well-known locally or nationally, but with a specific connection with Berkhamsted. Two prizes will be presented at the end of the summer term.

Book Sales We still have a few copies of books, which Nick Potts of the former 'Book Stack' asked us to sell on his behalf. We are charging a much-reduced price. Some of you may have seen that the Way Inn is selling copies of the Quiz Book, which Jimmie and Jenny Honour wrote a few years ago for Ottakar/Friths. They were purchased from a book dealer in Stroud. The Way Inn is selling them at the original retail price. The ones we have for sale were purchased from Friths and are sold at £5 (£6 for non-members)

A Potential Exhibition Area There are proposals for a small exhibition area in the former restaurant upstairs in the Way Inn. It will mainly display the work of local artists but we have been asked to display old photographs depicting earlier days of Berkhamsted. Negotiations are still in early stages.

Your Committee We now have nearly 250 members, admittedly a number of you live some distance away and some of you are no longer able to come to meetings. Amongst the hundred or so who attend meetings regularly there must be one or two who could usefully contribute to the Society by joining the Committee. We only have four committee meetings a year.
