# HONOR ET MANERIŪ DE BARKHAMSTEEDE IN COM. HERTFORD.

THE Veredict and Aunsweres of us the Juro<sup>rs</sup> of the said Honor & Manno<sup>r</sup> whose names are hereunder written To certaine Articles geven to us in charge to be inquired of and hereafter menconed at a Courte of Survey for the same Honor and Mannor holden theare the eight and twentieth daye of July Anno Dñi 1607 and in the yeeres of the raigne of our Sovereigne Lord King James of England Fraunce and Ireland the fiveth and of Scotland the fourtith. Before S<sup>r</sup> John Dodderidge Knight one of His Ma<sup>ties</sup> Sergeantes at lawe Connock Esquier Richard Martyn Esquire and Robert Paddon Esquier Commissioners w<sup>th</sup> others for that service assigned.

## THE ARTICLES GEVEN IN CHARGE TO THE JURORS viz<sup>t</sup>.

FIRST YOU SHALL DILIGENTLIE INQUIRE OF AND SETT DOWNE all the Circuits Buttes Boundes & lymittes of this Manno<sup>r</sup> and uppon what other Manno<sup>rs</sup> Lordshippes or landes the same dooth bounde and in what parishes the same dooe lye. And whether any confyning Lord or his tennantes doe any where intrude or incroch upon this Manno<sup>r</sup> where is it? by whom? and howe much is soe incroched?

2. *Ilm* what Manno<sup>rs</sup> are there parcells or members of this Honno<sup>r</sup> and where doe the same lie. And what severall Manno<sup>rs</sup> are there holden of this Hono<sup>r</sup>; and by what services are the same holden and who are the Owners and Lordes of the same Manno<sup>rs</sup> and of every of them? and what sutes, services, or fines are they and every of them bound to paye or accustomed to paye for release of their sute of Courte? and who doth or hath received the same and for how longe have the same beene paid?

3. *Ilm* what Courtes or Viewes of Franckpledge are there belonging to this Manno<sup>r</sup> or Hono<sup>r</sup> and where are the same kepte and whether is not a Courte Leete holden or to be holden at Barkhamstede as belonging to the said Hono<sup>r</sup> or Manno<sup>r</sup> and what daie certaine of the yeere have the same bene used to be holden?



4. *Item* what townes hamlettes or villages ought to doe suite and service to the said Courtes? And whether doe the Villages of Northchurch Willsterne a<sup>ls</sup> Willstone and Muswell or anie of them doe sutes unto the said Courtes and what fynes are there paid for their and every of their defaultes?

5. *Item* whether is there anie Court Baron or Hallymote Court belonging to the said Hono<sup>r</sup> or Mannor of Barkhamstede? And what tennauntes Townes Villages or Hamlettes ought to doe sute to the same and howe often in the yeere ought the same, or hath the same used to be kepte, and at what tyme and place?

6. *Item* what Courte Leete and Courte Baron hath there bene used to be kepte at Aldbury. And what times of the yeare? And what townes villages or hamlettes and what Tennants ought to doe suite and service thereunto? And whether doe the Inhabitan<sup>ts</sup> of the villages of Aldbury w<sup>th</sup> Helpstrop, Dunsley, Pendley, Wilsthorne, Grove, Wigington, Longmarston, Betlowe w<sup>th</sup> Waldwek, Dreyton, Beauchamp, Beauchampe Chedington, Goblingtot, Northcott Hill, or Northcott cum le Lee, or anie of them doe sute to the same Courte or Courtes? And what fyne is there paid by every of the said villages or hamlettes for their defaultes at anie of the said Courtes? And what severall free tennants ought to do sute and service to the said Courtes or to anie of them?

7. *Item* is there or ought there to be anie Courte Leete and Court Baron belonging to this Hono<sup>r</sup> of Barkhamstede holden or to be holden at Wingrave, and at what

tyme of the yeere is the same used to bee holden? And what Townshippes Villages and Hamlettes use to doe and ought to doe sute and service thereunto? And what ffynes have and ought to be paid by them and every of them at the said Courte? And whether doe any of the Villages of Wingrave, Brundesthorne, a<sup>ls</sup> Burstone, Wavedon a<sup>ls</sup> Wavingdon, Linford Magna, Hillesdon Weydon upon the Hill, Loughton, Wokington a<sup>ls</sup> Woughton, Moresley a<sup>ls</sup> Murseley, Weydon in le vale, Swanborne, Bellowse fee, Swanton, Cheyney a<sup>ls</sup> Chryneys ffee, Saldon, Weston, Underwood, Durston, Woughton sup le Greene or anie of them doe sute to the sayd Courte? And what other tennantes and Resyantes doe or ought to doe sute unto the same Courte?

8. *Item* is there or ought there to be anie Courte Leete belonging to this Hono<sup>r</sup> of Barkhamsted holden or to be holden at Haselbeech or Stony Stratford or at any other place within the Countie of Northampton? And at what tyme of the yeere is the same used to be holden or ought to be holden? And what Townshippes Villages and Hamlettes use to doe or ought to doe sute and service to the same Courte? And what fynes have or ought to bee paid by them and every of them at the said Courte? And whether doe these Townes Villages or Hamlettes following viz<sup>t</sup> Oldthorpe a<sup>ls</sup> Althorp cum Harleston, Charleton, Hanging Houghton, Bowden pva Eastefarnedon, Arthingworth, Haselbeech, Thurneby, Wolton a<sup>ls</sup> Welun, Preston sup montem, Furistho a<sup>ls</sup> Fursthoo cum Cosgrave, Dingley, Oxemden pva, Blakesley, Foxley, Charwelton, West Farnedon Midleton Oldstratford Eston a<sup>ls</sup> Esson cum Hulcott Snoseunbe Thorp juxta Daventree and Charleton juxta Newbottle or anie of them doe sute unto the same Courte? And what other Tennantes and Residentes doe or ought to doe sute unto the said Courte.



9. *Itm* what freeholders are there within this Honor and Mannor or doe belonge unto the same? What are the teñtes names & who held it before? What landes hold they? By what tenure doe they holde? & what services owe they to the Lord? what profittes arise to y<sup>e</sup> Lord by y<sup>e</sup> death of any freeholder by y<sup>e</sup> custome of y<sup>e</sup> said Mannor or otherwise?

10. *Itm* whether any freeholder within or belonging to this Honor & Mannor hath committed anie felony or treason, and hath beene thereof convicted? Whether hath the Kinge, or his p<sup>r</sup>decessors beene answered of the forfayture of the same? Whether anie such Tennant dyed w<sup>th</sup>out heire generall or speciall? if soe, who hath the p<sup>r</sup>sent use & possession of the lande? by what right? what land is it? where lyeth it? howe much in quantity & of what value?

11. *Itm* whether dooth anie Bastard holde any landes belonging to this Honor & Mannor as heire to any? what is his name? what land is it? where lyeth it? Who hath the p<sup>r</sup>sent use & possession thereof? & by what right? and what is it yeerely worth?

12. *Itm* what Demeasne landes hath the Lorde w<sup>th</sup>in or belonging to this Honor & Mannor? what and how much woodes underwoodes, meadowes, pastures, arrable, mores, marrishes, wastes, or commons? What is every acre worth by the yeare? what tennantes hold the same? whether by Indenture or otherwise? what land holde they? for what rente? under what Condiçions? And whether for terme of yeeres or lyves?

13. *Itm* what are the Customes of this Mannor in generall both on the behalfe of the Lord to performe or suffer to the benefite of the Tennantes: and of the Tennantes to pforme to the service of the Lord?

14. *Itm* whether is there anie Capitall or Mannor howse belonging to the Lord of this Mannor? and where did the same stande? and whether is the same nowe in ruine? and how longe hathe it soe contynued in ruine? and by whose default? and who nowe occupyeth the same, or the scite thereof? and whether any parte or howses be thereof at this present standing, and what is the p<sup>r</sup>sent state thereof?

15. *Itm* whether is the wood or woodgroundes called the ffryth sufficientlie inclosed and by whose defaulte? and howe many acres dooth the same conteyne? What be the boundes thereof, and what Common of pasture or Estovers have the Tennantes of this Honor or Mannor, or anie other therein? and what tyme of the yeere, and what is the same worth? and what Pannage is there in the said woodes and what is the same worth yeerely? And whether is or hath there beene any waste comitted in the same by felling of anie trees, or destroying of anie springes and by whom? where and howe much? And what is an acre of the same woodes worth one w<sup>th</sup> another now to bee solde? And whether is there any Woodward of the same wood, or of anie other the woodes of this Mannor, and what fees proffittes and commodities hath hee, or claymeth hee by vertue or cullo<sup>r</sup> of his office?

16. *Itm* yo<sup>u</sup> shall p<sup>r</sup>sent the names of all the Customary Tennantes belonging to this Honor & Mannor



as well those that are nowe the tennantes as those who held it last before. what landes or tenementes they holde. what every messuage or tenement is called. where it lyeth. what rent it payeth. what proffitt ariseth to the Lord by the death of anie such customary tennant, by ffyne, herriott or otherwise by the custome of the said Manno<sup>r</sup>. And whether they be all Customary Tennantes of Inheritaunce or Tennantes for terme of lyfe according to the custome of the Manno<sup>r</sup>.

17. *Itm* dooth the customary lande of this Hono<sup>r</sup> or Manno<sup>r</sup> by yo<sup>r</sup> Custome discende after the death of any auncesto<sup>r</sup> eyther to the younger or elder sonne? And whether will the custome allowe an intayle by Coppie? whether dooth it beare widdowes estate or for terme of lyfe though shee marry? and whether may a man holde by the Courtesie?

18. *Itm* are not the fynes for the admittance of every newe customary Tennant; whether hee come in as heire or uppon surrender or by purchase at the Will of the Lord certaine yea or noe? and who dooth receive the same and by what warrant? And whether are the same aunswere yea or noe?

19. *Itm* howe and by what meanes may a Customary tennant of this Manno<sup>r</sup> forfeite his coppihold Tenement, whether by felling of Tymber trees: suffering his howse to decaye; pulling downe anie howses: committing anie willfull waste: devising or letting his customary tenement otherwise then the custome of the Manno<sup>r</sup> will beare, or for committing anie other acte contrary to the custome of the Manno<sup>r</sup>. And whether hath anie tennant of this

Manno<sup>r</sup> offended in anie of those thinges? who is it? and where is any such offence committed?

20. *Itm* what Commons are there w<sup>th</sup>in the Lordshipp which doe properlie belonge to the Lord & Tennantes of this Manno<sup>r</sup>? howe are the Tennantes stinted for their beastes eyther after the proportion of their land or rente? how have the same Commons heretofore or nowe bene used? and what proffitt ariseth or groweth to the Lord yeerely by the same?

21. *Itm* whether hath anie man to yo<sup>r</sup> knowledg incroched anie parte of the Lordes wastes by inclosure or adding anie parte to his owne landes? who hath soe donne? where? how much? and how longe it hath contynued?

22. *Itm* whether is there w<sup>th</sup>in this Hono<sup>r</sup> or Manno<sup>r</sup> anie villaine or neife, namely anie bondman or bondwoman? yf there be, what are their names? what landes doe they holde? and what is the same yeerely worth?

23. *Itm* what Customary Cottages toftes Croftes or Curtilages are there w<sup>th</sup>in this Hono<sup>r</sup> & Manno<sup>r</sup>? What are the Tennantes names? what rentes paye they? and what services doe they? And whether are there w<sup>th</sup>in this Hono<sup>r</sup> and Manno<sup>r</sup> anie newe erected tenementes or Cottages w<sup>th</sup>out the Lordes licence? Where are they, and by whom were they builte, by whose licence, and upon what consideraçon.



24. *Item* whether hath the Lord of this Mannor anie Customary Watermill, or wynde myll belonging to this Mannor and whether is there anie mill decayed w<sup>th</sup>in this Mannor? And whether doe not the tenñtes of this Mannor owe their sute of grynding of their griste and Corne to such Milles? What are they worth by the yeere And in whose occupaçon are they or anie of them?

25. *Item* whether hath anie Tennant or other person w<sup>th</sup>in this Hono<sup>r</sup> and Mannor removed anie mearestone Land marke or other bounde betwene this Mannor or anie other Mannor or Lordshippe or betwene the Lordes demesnes and the Tennantes freeholde or customary land of this Mannor, where is anie such offence coñmitted? by whom? and where ought the same boundes soe removed or taken awaie to stand?

26. *Item* whether hath the Lord any pticular fishing w<sup>th</sup>in anie brooke, water, or river w<sup>th</sup>in this Mannor? where or howe farre dooth it extend? what is it yeerely worth? And whether hath the Lord any fowling w<sup>th</sup>in this Mannor by meanes of anie Moores, Marshes, Water brookes and such like? And who taketh the proffitt of them?

27. *Item* whether hath the Lord of this Mannor all waifes, estraies, fellons goodes, and treasure found w<sup>th</sup>in the Mannor and such like profittes? And whether hath hee bene trulie aunswered for them or not? and who hath received the same? or claimeth to have the same, and by what graunt and warrant?

28. *Item* whether is there w<sup>th</sup>in this Hono<sup>r</sup> and Mannor anie markt weekely fayre or fayres at anie tyme of the yeare kepte w<sup>th</sup>in this Mannor, and what daie or daies? Who hath or taketh the tolle or proffitte of the same? what is it? or may it be worth to the Lord yeereley?

29. *Item* who hath the Advowsoñ, nominaçon, donaçon & guifte of anie parsonage vicaredge or free Chappell w<sup>th</sup>in this Hono<sup>r</sup> and Mannor? whether is it anie impropriaçon belonging to the Lord of this Mannor or to anie other? who is Incumbent of the Parsonage or Vicaridge? who hath the impropriaçon in use, and what is it worth by the yeere?

30. *Item* who is the Lordes Bayliff of this Mannor? whether holdeth hee the same by Letteres Patentes or at the Lordes will? what yeerely fee hath hee; and who is steward of the Lordes Courtes? whether holdeth hee by Patent or at will? what fee hath hee? and what other officers are there w<sup>th</sup>in or belonging to this hono<sup>r</sup> or Mannor? And what are their fees? And what benefites and commodities doe they or anie of them challenge as incident and belonging to their severall offices.

31. *Item* whether have anie of yo<sup>r</sup> or anie other person to yo<sup>r</sup> knowledge any deedes evidences Court rolles, Lieger Books of Survey or of the Customes, accomptes or recordes touching or concerning this hono<sup>r</sup> and Mannor and in whose custody are the same.



32. *Item* whether was or is the Manno<sup>r</sup> of Mawdlyn holden of this Manno<sup>r</sup> or Hono<sup>r</sup> of Barkhamsteede, yea or noe? And by what tenure, rentes, and services is or was the same Manno<sup>r</sup> of Mawdlyn nowe dissolved? and whether have they that were Coppiholders of the said Manno<sup>r</sup> purchased the freeholde of their Coppiholde, and their names? And what is every such Coppiholde, whereof the freeholde is soe purchased yearely worth? And who are nowe the severall Occupiers of the same?

THE AUNSWERE OF THE SAID JURORS TO THE  
PRECEDENT ARTICLES AS FOLLOWETH.

TO THE FIRST ARTICLE, wee aunswere and p'sente, That the Circuite, Buttes Boundes and Lymittes of this Manno<sup>r</sup> begyninge at a place called Lyons Corner, lyeing North from the towne of Barkhamstead, & thence leading Northward, goeth alonge by a wood called Northwood parcell of the Manno<sup>r</sup> of Asheridge in the parrish of Barkhamsteede, and from thence to Asheridge Parke corner in the same parish: And soe to Prince Hatch likewise w<sup>th</sup>in the same parrish: And from thence to a Lane called Stony Lane in the parish of Nettleden and so downe along Freesden Valley to the first bound of the corner of Southwoode in the pish of Barkh'msteed And soe lying eastward alonge by Southwood, unto Swilly Pond in the same parrish, and from thence to Grymes Ditch in the same parrish: And from thence in a directe lyne unto Shermans bounde in the same parrish. And soe in a lane leading towardes Hemelhempstead & through a Pond there called Sales Pittes ponde in the parrish of Barkhamstead St. Mary a<sup>t</sup>s Northchurch. And from thence Eastward abutteth uppon the land of William Hawkins parcell of the Manno<sup>r</sup> of Hemelhempstead in the parrish of Hemelhempstead, And thence Eastward downe a Valley unto the Kinges highwaye by the howse of Will'm Howe of the Pyckes on the east syde in the same parrish; And soe over the said Highway unto the common ryver in the same parrish. And soe over the same River unto Flagg Lane, and from thence unto the Kinges Highway leading from Barkhampstead to



Bourne bridge in the parrish of Barkhamsted St. Mary als Northchurch. And from Bourne Bridge alonge the Bourne to Pytt Meade Corner in the parrish of Bovingdon, abutting South East uppon the Manno<sup>r</sup> of Hemelhempstead. And from Pitt Meade Corner alonge the Bottom Southwarde uppon Mounsell Common w<sup>th</sup>in the Lordshipp of Chesham in the parrish of Chesham. And soe upp to Whitehill Bottome in the same parrish And from thence alonge unto a Bottome called Hockeridg Bottome in the same parrish. And from thence alonge by Bushgrounde to a place called Hogg Lane in the same parrish. And from thence downe the waie leading by Mill feildes to Chesham waie in the same parrish. And from thence along by the groundes of Leonard Bachello<sup>r</sup> w<sup>th</sup>in the parrish of Hawridge unto the groundes of Edward Hollyman w<sup>th</sup>in the Lordshipp of Tringe in the parrish of Tring And soe alonge westward uppon the said Manno<sup>r</sup> of Tring unto Birche Parke in the same parrish. And soe along by the said Parke to a place called Bellams Breade in the same parrish. And from thence to a greene called Round Greene, abutting westward uppon the Manno<sup>r</sup> and parrish of Aldbury, And from thence to a meade called Sutton Meade in the same parrish. And soe alonge to Hawe Crofte Deane in the same parrish. And from thence to Picked Close Corner in the same parrish. And from thence to Hitchin Gate in the same parrish. And from thence to Nun Corner in the same parrish soe straight along to Lyons Corner in the same parish where wee first began. And this wee take to bee the true perambula<sup>con</sup> of the utmost Circuite Buttes Boundes and Lymittes of this Manno<sup>r</sup>. And wee knowe not of anie confyning Lord or his tennantes that doe intrude or incroche w<sup>th</sup>in the Lymittes of this Manno<sup>r</sup>.

## 2.

TO THE SECOND ARTICLE, wee the said Juro<sup>r</sup>s (*John Gardner, Frauncis Wethered, Richard Wood, William Edlyn, Will<sup>m</sup> Cock, James Dawbney and Will<sup>m</sup> Willett only excepted and exemted from us, for that there is in this Article that in some sort maye concerne them*) doe aunswere and presente, That there are noe Manno<sup>r</sup>s that are parcells or members of this Hono<sup>r</sup> to our knowledges. But there are divers Manno<sup>r</sup>s holden of this Hono<sup>r</sup> viz<sup>t</sup> the Manno<sup>r</sup> of Mawdlyns, whereof nowe the cheife howse and about one hundred accres is in the tenure of John Gardner aforesayd lying w<sup>th</sup>in the parrish of Northchurch, which is holden by the yeerely rente of Twenty shillinges fealtie, and sute of Courte for ought to us yet appeareth. The Manno<sup>r</sup> of Northcott Court lying w<sup>th</sup>in the same parrish holden (as wee conceive it) by the yearely rente of xxviii<sup>s</sup> ix<sup>d</sup> and the like services, whether by anie other service wee knowe not. And the Manno<sup>r</sup> of Durrants is now it is or reputed to be lying w<sup>th</sup>in the same parrish & holden by the yeerely rent of xxvj<sup>s</sup> vj<sup>d</sup> and the like services as wee conceive it. W<sup>ch</sup> severall Manno<sup>r</sup>s are long sithence dismembered and divers severall persons are owners thereof whose names are hereafter men<sup>c</sup>oned, for anie fynes that the pticular Tennantes of the said Manno<sup>r</sup>s are bound to paie or usuallie doe paye for their release of their sute of Courte, wee knowe of none. But sute of Courte is due and done for the same.



## 3.

TO THE THIRD ARTICLE we aunswere and p'sent, That there are two Courte Leetes or Viewes ffranckpledg belonging to this Manno<sup>r</sup> or Hon<sup>r</sup> yeerely for the most part kepte w<sup>th</sup>in the Castell, at two tymes in the yeere (That is to saye) on the Monday in the Whitson weeke: and on the Mondaie next after the feast of S<sup>t</sup> Michaell Tharchaungell. But uppon some extraordinary occasion (as in the tyme of sicknes) the same Courtes w<sup>th</sup>in the memory of man uppon the same daies have beene kepte at an Oake w<sup>th</sup>in the Parke neere unto the sayd Castell: and at a Willowe w<sup>th</sup>out the said Parke uppon a moore neere unto the said Castell banck. And there are also two other Courtes Leete or viewes of ffranckpledg belonging to the said Manno<sup>r</sup> or Hono<sup>r</sup> yeerely kept likewise w<sup>th</sup>in the Towne or Burrough of Barkhamstead at two tymes in the yeere (That is to saie) on the Tewesday in Whitson weeke, and on the Tewesdaie next after the feaste of S<sup>t</sup> Michaell tharchaungell w<sup>ch</sup> Courtes for the most parte have beene and yet are usually kepte w<sup>th</sup>in the Church howse of Barkhamstead aforesaid.

## 4.

TO THE FOURTH ARTICLE wee aunswere and p'sent, That the Townes of Barkhamstead S<sup>t</sup> Peter and Barkhamstead S<sup>t</sup> Mary als Northchurch and some of the Inhabitanes of Wilsterne als Willston and of Miswell, onely Thomas Wheeler (the sayd Wilsterne and Miswell being held by reputa<sup>co</sup>n as a member of Northchurch) doe owe sute and service to the said Courtes. And that there hath beene usually such fynes sett uppon those Inhabitanes of the places aforesaid that have made defaulte as hath beene thought fitt by the Affearo<sup>rs</sup> at the same Courtes. But howe the fynes soe imposed (as aforesaid) have beene paid wee knowe not. And therefore for certainty thereof wee referr o<sup>r</sup> selves to the Bayliff of the said Manno<sup>r</sup>, to whose charge, as we conceive, it belongeth to collecte and receive the same.



5.

TO THE FIFTE ARTICLE wee answered and p'sent, That there is also belonging to this Honor or Man-  
no' a Court Baron or Hallynote Courte holden w<sup>th</sup>in the  
Castell of Barkhamstede, And that there are divers  
tenantes as well freeholders as copyholders, w<sup>ch</sup> are  
heereafter p<sup>re</sup>cularlie named that doe or ought to doe  
their sute to the same.

6, 7, 8.

TO THE SIXT, SEAVEN, AND EIGHT AR-  
TICLES, wee can say nothing directlie of our owne  
knowledges. And wee take it (under reformation) That  
the matters in the sayd Articles conteyned doe meere-  
ly apperteyne to the Juro<sup>r</sup> impanelled for the Counties of  
Buckingham and Northampton to inquire of and answer  
for that the same were comitted to their charge.



## 9.

That by the Custome of this Manno<sup>r</sup> beyound the memorie of māñ, one Coppihold tennant of the same Manno<sup>r</sup> in the p'sence of one other copyholde tennant of the same Manno<sup>r</sup> maye take a surrendo<sup>r</sup> of anie Customary coppiholde landes or tenem<sup>tes</sup> of this Manno<sup>r</sup> And in tyme of necessitie one Tennant aloane maie take the like surrenders. And the Steward likewise of this Manno<sup>r</sup> or his Deputie maie take surrenders of Coppyholde landes and tenem<sup>tes</sup> aloane eyther in Courte or out of Courte by the Custome likewise of this Manno<sup>r</sup>. And allso every Customary tennant of the said Manno<sup>r</sup> by the custome of this Manno<sup>r</sup> may at their pleasures pull downe, or erecte and builde uppon their Coppiholde tenem<sup>tes</sup>. And have and take likewise by the said Custome to their owne uses, All tymber trees woodes and underwoodes that are or shalbe growing uppon their said Coppiholde landes or tenem<sup>tes</sup> to builde, sell, or otherwise to dispose of as seemeth good to them. And by the same custome the same Coppihold tennantes have an estate of Inheritance to them & their heires for ever of and in the same Coppiholde landes and tenem<sup>tes</sup>. And maie also at their pleasures digg chalke, claye and sande, or anie other thinge w<sup>th</sup>in their owne Coppiholde landes or tenem<sup>tes</sup> w<sup>th</sup>out anie licence in that behalfe, to be had or obteyned from the lordes of this Manno<sup>r</sup> for the same. And by the Custome of the same Manno<sup>r</sup> a Coppiholde tennant

of this Manno<sup>r</sup> may lett a lease of this Coppiholde landes or tenem<sup>tes</sup> for three yeeres or a lesser tyme, w<sup>th</sup>out the Licence of the lord of this Manno<sup>r</sup>. And wee p<sup>'</sup>sent also that the Customes of this Manno<sup>r</sup> in generall on the behalfe of the tennantes to p<sup>'</sup>forme to the service of the lordes tyme out of mynde of ma<sup>n</sup> are theis. THAT IS TO SAYE. That the customary ten<sup>n</sup>tes of this Manno<sup>r</sup>, are to doe their sute and services of Courte at the Courtes to be holden for the said Manno<sup>r</sup>. And that uppon the death of every coppinghold tennant, there is to be paid to the lord of this Manno<sup>r</sup>, and likewise uppon surrender or alienacon of anie Coppiholde p<sup>'</sup>misses, onely one yeeres rent for a fyne certaine, viz<sup>t</sup>. soe much money as the rent is w<sup>ch</sup> is paid to the Lord for one whole yeere. And every Coppiholder is likewise to paie to the Lord of this manno<sup>r</sup> the rentes due to him for such Coppiholde landes and tenem<sup>tes</sup> as he holdeth of him w<sup>th</sup>in this Manno<sup>r</sup>, at the feastes and tymes accustomed for the same.

And wee saie That the same is nowe in ruine and soe hath beene and contynued for a longe tyme beyound o<sup>r</sup> memories. But by what defaulte wee knowe not. And that the same w<sup>th</sup> the scite thereof is nowe occupied by S<sup>r</sup> Edward Cary Knight. And that the said S<sup>r</sup> Edward Cary hath builded certaine howses for his necessary use, w<sup>th</sup>in the p<sup>'</sup>cincte of the said Castle.



15.

TO THE FIFTEENTH ARTICLE wee aunswere and p'sent, That there is a Wood or Woodground called the Fryth w<sup>ch</sup> is not at all inclosed nor ever hath been w<sup>th</sup>in the memory of mañ. And for the certaintie of the number of acres thereof, and howe the boundes thereof doe extende themselves, wee referre o'selves to a certaine plott or mapp heereunto annexed and thereof made by John Ewar one of the Juro<sup>rs</sup> nowe impannelled & sworne for this service, and by one Henry Pratt. And wee doe further saye, That the Inhabitantes & tennantes of this Manno<sup>r</sup> dwelling w<sup>th</sup>in Barkhamsteede & Northchurch have used by auncient custome to have pceive and take in the Fryth and other the waste groundes herbage & pannage, Bushes, furzes, stubbes and fearne for their necessary uses for their landes and tenem<sup>ts</sup> and common of pasture in the sayd Fryth and other the Commons & Waste groundes of the said Manno<sup>r</sup> for all manner their Cattell, at all tymes of the yeere, *sans number*. And wee saie further, That the Fryth and other the waste groundes, cannot be estimated at anie yeerely value, by reason the Tennantes & Inhabitantes aforesaid are manie that perceive and take the benefite thereof. And the Pannage likewise can be nothing worth to the lord of the Manno<sup>r</sup> for that the tennantes have allwaies had the benefite thereof. And wee fynde further, that M<sup>r</sup> Francis Wethered sithence All Hallow tyde laste, did fell or cause to be felled in the Frythe neere the parke, to the number of one hundred and twenty Beeches in the name of twenty loades of ffee wood, w<sup>ch</sup> wee value at tenn poundes. And

wee fynde further, that the same Frauncis hath felled Twenty nyne oakes, whereof two of them were felled about Michaellmas w<sup>ch</sup> was in Anno Dñi 1607, and twenty seaven sithence Maie daie being in Anno Dñi 1608, w<sup>ch</sup> wee value at eighteene poundes. And that the same Oakes (as wee are informed) were felled by p'tence of a Warrant from the late Lord Trēr for the making of a pownde for this Hono<sup>r</sup> of Barkhamsteede w<sup>ch</sup> pounce is there made. And wee knowe not of anie other wastes heeretofore committed w<sup>th</sup>in the said Manno<sup>r</sup> other then such as have beene formerly p'sented at other Courtes held for the said Manno<sup>r</sup>. And wee fynde further that Frauncis White hath felled and solde divers small trees in the same Fryth, But what the same woodes are now worth by the acre, wee knowe not. And wee fynde also that M<sup>r</sup> Francis Wethered is woodward of the same Woodes: but what fees proffittes and commodities hee hath or ought to have, wee knowe not.

TO THE SIXTEENTH ARTICLE wee aunswere and present, That the names of all the Customary tenants belonging to this Hono<sup>r</sup> and Manno<sup>r</sup> as well of those w<sup>ch</sup> are nowe the tennantes in possession as allso of those (to the uttermost of o<sup>r</sup> knowledges) w<sup>ch</sup> were the p<sup>re</sup>cedent tennantes thereof w<sup>th</sup> their landes and tenem<sup>tes</sup> Customary w<sup>ch</sup> they & every of them doe houlde. And the names of soe many of the said customary Messuages or tenem<sup>tes</sup> and landes that are knowne by anie pticular names, and where the same lye, together w<sup>th</sup> the severall rentes w<sup>ch</sup> every of them doe pay: and likewise what proffitt ariseth to the lord by the death of anie such tennant in fyne or otherwise, by the Custome of the said Manno<sup>r</sup> and howe they and every of them holdeth the same, whether by estate of Inheritaunce or for terme of lyfe, are pticularly and at large sett forth and declared in manner & forme following. viz<sup>t</sup>

Northchurch is in the guifte of S<sup>r</sup> Edward Cary Knight  
under the lease or graunt made by Queene Elizabeth to  
S<sup>r</sup> Thomas Bemor about an<sup>o</sup> sçdo p'dce Regine. And as  
for anie Vicaredge or free Chappell w<sup>th</sup>in this Hono<sup>r</sup> or  
Manno<sup>r</sup> wee know of none neyther are the same parsonages  
impropriate. And wee p'sent further that Thomas New-  
mañ Clerk is Rector & incumbent to the Rectory of Bark-  
hamsteed S<sup>t</sup> Peter: And that John Hopkins Clerk is  
rector & incumbent to the rectory of Barkhamsteed S<sup>t</sup>  
Mary als Northchurch. And that the Rectory of Bark-  
hamsteede S<sup>t</sup> Peter is yeerely worth xx<sup>s</sup> and that the  
Rectory of Barkhamsteed S<sup>t</sup> Mary als Northchurch is  
yeerely woorth twenty one poundes & ten shillings.



TO THE THIRTIETH ARTICLE we answer and  
 present, That M<sup>r</sup> Francis Wetherell hath the office of  
 the Kings Bayliffe of this Manor by grant from the  
 Scherke to whom the office belongeth, by tenure in a  
 respect of lands called Sannere as is shewed, But  
 what yearly fee hee hath for the execution of the same  
 office, we knowe not. And we are also that M<sup>r</sup>  
 Edward Cary Knight is High Sheriff of the same  
 Countie and holdeth the same office by the Patente of  
 the late Queen Elizabeth dated aboute the 2<sup>d</sup> December  
 1588, But what fee hee hath for his service therein  
 we knowe not. And we are also that there are no  
 other officers w<sup>thin</sup> or belonping to this Manor & Manor  
 to our knowledges, then are before mentioned.

TO THE ONE AND THIRTIETH ARTICLE we  
 answer & present, That we are not of our knowledges  
 nor other persons of our knowledges who have taken the  
 same Countie since the Kings death, as before, as it is  
 contained amongst us in the same writing as concerning  
 the Manor of Manor. And we are also that we have  
 taken nothing by us since the death of the  
 said Countie, and therefore have againe in this  
 writing as before in the same Countie as it is the Manor  
 & Manor, nothing in our power sheweth us  
 before and we continuing in our power the  
 Manor.

TO THE TWO AND THIRTITH ARTICLE wee aunswere and present, That the Manno<sup>r</sup> of Mawdlyn<sup>s</sup> w<sup>ch</sup> is nowe dismembred, is, and alwaies heeretofore hath beene reputed to be holden of this Hono<sup>r</sup> of Barkhamsteede, And that soe much thereof as is in the handes of John Gardner yeildeth twenty shillings rent p annū and the residue of the said Manno<sup>r</sup> & rentes is pticularlie before expressed: & that fealty sute of Courte is due for the said Manno<sup>r</sup>, but what other services wee knowe not, Nor anie Coppiholders of that Manno<sup>r</sup> that hath purchased the ffreeholde of his Coppyholde, and further aunswere to this Article we cannot geve.
