The Verditt and Answer of Us the Jurors whose Names are hereunder written being Tenants of the Severall Mannors of the Borough of Hallimote within the said Honor, unto certain Articles hereafter mentioned. Upon full Consideracon and Deliberation had thereupon being given Us in Charge to be enquired of at the Court holden for the said Hon at the Castle of Barkhamsted the 22th day of October 1616 and in the Years of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord King James by the Grace of God of England Scotland France & Ireland Defender of the Faith &c. of England France & Ireland the 14th and of Scotland the 50th before John Norden Deputy Survey to His Highness, and Edward Salter Esq' High Steward of the said Honor.

THE ARTICLES DELIVERD TO US IN CHARGE.

FIRST TO INQUIRE AND PRESENT THE PARTICULARS of all the Demeasnes both of arrable Land Meadow Pasture and Woodground. And whether any of the Same be aliend in Fee or granted by Copie, and to whom, how long since, and by whom, what is it & where lyes it.

- 2. What are the Mann¹³ Townships Hamlets Graunges Formes Lands and Tenements that do belong or appertain unto this Mann² or Hon² of Barkhamsted within the Limits of the Borough and Hallimote, and who are the Severall Tenants that ought to do suit unto any of the Prince's Courts holden there for the same, and every particular Parcell thereof or that have been accustomably called to do their suit in or to any of His Highness Courts there. By what Rents Services and Tenures do they particularly hold to your knowledg or as you have heard. And whether do they their orderly Suits, or are they at their Fines; if so what Fines pay they or who receives their Fines, and to whom is it answerd to your knowledges or as You have heard, and what may the Fines amount unto by Year.
- 3. What Freeholders are there within or belonging to this Hon^r Of whom hold they their Lands, by what Tenures Rents and Services, Whether after their Deaths or upon Alienacon, is there paid or payable a Heriot or Relief.

- 9. Whether are there any Lands Tenements Rents Suits Service or Tenures concealed detained denyed withheld or usurped how long by whom and what is it.
- 10. Whether are there any Lands free or customary given or Surrendred in in Mortmayne which hold or ought to hold of the Prince, what is it, and of what Tenure Rent and Service.
- 11. Whether has any Freehold Tenant that is also a Tenant by Copie or Lease or at Will, altered the Divisions or Partition Hedges between the free and Copie or leased Lands whereby the true Bounds cannot appear.
- 12. Also to inquire & present what Incroachments have been made upon the Prince's Wast, by erecting of Houses Walls Pales Ditches or digging of Earth, Clay Lome Chalk Marle or the like, where & by whom by what Warrant & under what Rent.
- 13. By what Warrant do the Tenants or Bayliffs of the Burrough take the Wayns Estrays &c. to their own Uses and what may they be worth comonly & Ann. whether pay they any Rent and to whom.

TO THE FIRST ARTICLE CONCERNING THE DEMEASNES WEE ANSWER AND PRESENT THAT

THOMAS MURRY Esqr holdeth the Scite Circuit and Precinct of the Castle of Barkhamsted with the Park containing together by Estimacon Seven hundred Acres be they more or less And also divers Meadows containing by Estimation two & twenty Acres and a half be they more or less lyeing by the River Side between the Parke Gate and Gossams Lane End and weh sometimes were four or five Severall Meadows scituate lyeing or being in the Parish of Barkhamsted St. Peters, And one other Meadow called Lords Mead containing by Estimation Seaven Acres be it more or less lying in the Parish of Barkhamsted St. Mary als Northchurch But how he holdeth the same Wee know not.

WILLIAM BALDWYN holdeth the One half of Great Castle Field divided into four Closes containing by Estimacon 80 Acres be they more or less within the Parish of Barkhamsted St. Peters aforesaid which Rafe Axtell lately deceased held by Lease from the late Queen Eliz : And also six Acres of Meadow lyeing in severall Pieces called Castle Meadows adjoyning to the said Castle Field by the said Lease by the yearly Rent of £2 . 3 . 4 for the said arrable Land & Meadow, which said Lease is determind

The said WILLIAM BALDWIN holdeth a part of one Wickplot containing by Estimation about the Tenth part NORDEN'S SURVEY.

ANSWED.

WILLIAM EDLYN holdeth the other half of great Castle Field being divided into five parts containing by Estimation 80 Acres be they more or less. And Six Acres of Meadow in one Peice be it more or less adjoyning to the said Castle Field, which the said William Edlyn holdeth by Lease from the said late Queen Elizabeth by the Yearly Rent of £2 * 3 * 4 for the said arrable Land & Meadow which Lease is yet in being undetermind £2 3s. 4d.

OLIVER HAINES holdeth one Field called Little Castle Field being divided into 7 parts with a Meadow of Two Acres or thereabout adjoyning to the said Castle Field conf together by Estimation 80 Acres with a little Plot of Ground called Bigginswick containing 1 Acre or thereabout went the said Oliver Haines & John Haines deceased Brother to the said Oliver held by Lease from the said late Qu: Elizabeth by the Yearly Rent of £1,6,8 which Lease is yet in being undetermind . £1 6s.8d.

Francis Wethered the Lords Bayliffe holdeth one peice of Land containing by Estimation one Acre be it more or less called the Bayliff's Acre lyeing in a Close called Nether Close whereof the said Bayliffe & his Father before him being likewise Bayliffe have had the Profits thereof for many years past, But whether it be Parcell of the Demeasns, or by what title he holdeth it Wee do not certainly know but the said Francis Wethered has informed Us he holdeth it in the Right of the Freeschooll of Barkhamsted as belonging to the Baylywick web Acre of Land Wee esteem to be worth 3s. 4d. yearly

There are also two Mills vizt The Upper Mill in the Occupation of George Collins & the other in the Occupation of Richard Besouth with the Banks to the said Nether Mill containing by Estimation 1 Acre & a half or thereabts as they are now inclosed, But how they hold them or what Rent they pay Wee know not.

There is also one great Comon or Waste Ground of Pasture & Wood called the Fryth, And one other great Waste Ground called Barkhamsted Heath And one other little Waste Ground called the Little Heath.

There are also two other little plots of Ground by the Name of Brickhill Green & Shuters Way.

There is also one Wast plott or Moor lyeing by the River near the Upper Mill, and one little Wast Plott or moor lyeing at a Place called Bank Mill.

In all which Wast Grounds or Comons the Tenants of the said Borough & Hallimote have Time out of Memory of Man used to have Comon.

And touching the last part of the said Article Wee know not of any part of the Demeasns aliend in Fee or granted by Copy, other than some little parcells thereof granted by Copy which are plainly set forth among the Presentments of the Copyholds and Incroachments.

Which Premises before mentioned all are the Demeasus as well inclosed as not inclosed for ought Wee know to the contrary except certain Lands hereafter mentioned lyeing upon Hunt's hill which are likely to be Demeasus as appeareth more at large in the Auswer to the 25 Article touching Hunt's Lands.

There are certain Spittle Houses which Edmond Young Esqr holdeth by Letters Patents vizt. The Over Spittle House als St. John the Evangelist Spittle House, and the other the Nether Spittle House als St. Leonard's Spittle House with four Tenements or Cottages belonging to the Same and divers Parcells of arrable Land Meadow Pasture & Wood Ground containg by Estimation 164 Acres be they more or less together with the Scites Circuits and Precincts thereof and 13s. & 4d. Rent which as Wee are informed he holdeth in Capite by certain Letters Patents whereunto Wee refer Our Selves which Letters Patents were shewed to the Commissioners of the former Survey in the behalf of Prince Henry about 10 years last past

THE SECOND ARTICLE Wee likewise answer that there be divers Mannors belonging or appertaining unto the Honour of Barkhamsted within the Limits or Bounds of the Borough & [or] Hallimote of Barkhamsted which said Mannours are holden of the Prince his Highness as of his said Honour of Barkhamsted lyeing within the Severall Parishes of Barkhamsted St. Peters Barkhamsted St. Mary ats Northchurch.

Barkhamsted & 56 Acres of arrable Land Meadow Pasture & Woodground in the Severall Parishes of Barkhamsted St. Peters and Barkhamsted St. Mary ats Northchurch which one Henry Seare holdeth to him & his Heirs of the Prince his Highness as of his said Honor of Barkhamsted in free and Common Soccage by Fealty Suit of court & Relief when it happeneth upon Death only, which is a years Rent according to the Yearly Quit Rent paid for the same, and by the yearly Rent of £1 . 6 . 6 which said Henry Seare receiveth divers Quit Rents of divers Freeholders hereafter pticularly mentioned as belonging to the said Mannor, and affirmeth that he and all those whose Estate he hath Time out of Memory of Man have quietly enjoyed the same or the more part thereof without any Denyall or Contradiccon

And also one other mannor called Northcote Court or Northcote Hill Court 3 Tenements & 90 Acres of arrable Land Meadow Pasture and Woodground in the said Parish of Barkhamsted St. Mary als Northehurch which

one William Edlyn likewise holdeth to him and his Heirs of the Prince his Highness his Highness of his said Honor of Barkhamsted by like Tenure & Service and by the yearly Rent of 5^s 7^d and doth likewise receive divers Quit Rents of divers Freeholders hereafter particuliarly mentiond as belonging to the said mannr And affirmeth That he and all those whose Estate he has Time out of Memory of Man have quietly enjoyed the same or the more part thereof without any Denyall or Contradiction.

And also one others mann' or Scite of a mannor called Mawdlyns & 110 Acres of Land be it more or less lyeing in the said Parish of Barkhamsted St Mary ats Northchurch weh Robt Bradley Genth likewise holdeth to him & his Heirs of the Prince his Highness as of his said Hon of Barkhamsted by the Tenure & Service aforesaid and by the yearly Rent of 20s But as Wee are credibly informed there was 2s Rent more paid by the late Owners of the said mann'r of Mawdlyns for a Grove called Nully [Mully] Grove whiles the same Grove was in their hands, and the said Rent yet continued & duly paid by one Thomas Southen now Owner of the said Grove by the Devise of his Father John Southen deceased who purchased the same of John Gardner late Owner of the said mann'r of Mawdlyns, And yet as Wee are likewise further informed That the said Grove was no parcell of the said mann' but was purchased of one William Martyn who was not Owner of the said mann' And that a great part of the sd mann and the Tenancies thereof are dismemberd & sold away by the former Owners thereof, And no Court holden there for the sa Mann' within the Time of Memory of Man nor any Quit Rents remaining due unto the now Owner of the sa mann to Our knowledg. All which Owners of the said Mann' and their Tenants are have been usually called to his Highness Court or Courts holden within the said Burrough or Hallymote in which their Lands lye and there do their orderly Suits or else amerced if not essoyned or spared, and not any Suit Fine for ought Wee know.

And Wee further answer That Wee know not any

other mann^{rs} Townships, Hamlets Graunges Farmes Lands and Tenem^{ts} within or belonging to this Hon^r except such as are hereafter pticularly set forth. That is to say

Divers Antient Capitall messuages which are conceived by some of the Owners thereof to be mann^{rs} and to have divers Quit Rents belonging unto them which as they affirm both they and all others whose Estate they have in the said Capitall Messuages have enjoyed the s⁴ Quit Rents or most of them accordingly without any Denyall or Contradiction or other questioning thereof but only some stay of Payment made by some untill it might appear for what Lands or Tenements the same were due or whether they had the said Lands or Tenem^{ts} for which the said Rents were demanded which said Capitall Messuages so conceived to be Mann^{rs} are those following Viz^t

The Rectory or Parsonage Hous of Northchurch whereof John Hopkins Clerk one of the King's Majesty's Chaplains in ordinary as endowed in the Right of his Church.

There is one Meadow called Ally's Mead or Ashe Mead containing by Estimation 8 Acres which Sr Edward Carev Knt late held of the Prince his Highness as of his said Honr to him & his Heires in Free & Comon Soccage by Fealty & suit of Court & Relief after Death only weh is a years Rent, which sd Meadow the sd Sr Edw Carey, as Wee are informed hath sold to the Prince his Highness and now is in the Tenure or Occupation of Thomas Murrey Esqr but how he holdeth the same Wee know not, but the antient Rent thereof was .

JAMES MAYNE Esqr holdeth to him and his Heirs of the Prince his Highness as of his said Hon or Mann of

the same within the Time of Our memory, Yet Wee do know that during all the Time of Our Memory that as well the said John Hopkins & others his Predecessors Parsons there. And the Owners of the said Capitall Messuages as the Owners of the sd Mann's before mentioned have usually received divers Quit Rents or the most part of them of divers Freeholders, and divers others likewise received Quit Rents of other Freeholders and have heard that they have been enjoyed accordingly Time out of Memory of Man, nevertheless they do not intend but is far from them & every of them to withdraw any such Freeholders from doing their Suit & Service at his Highness Court. All which Quit Rents so paid to others as aforesaid were presented in a terrior by themselves at a late Court of Survey holden for the said Hon by the King's Maty's Speciall Commission in behalf of the said late Prince Henry his Highness about 10 years last past to be due & payable to others & entered next after the Terrior of the Freehold Lands which paid Quit Rents to the Chief Lord. Neither do Wee know certainly of any yearly Rent paid for the same, but as Wee have heard that the said Bayliffes do pay Yearly for the same and for the Fayre and Market 20 Shillings to the Prince His Highness or to his Bayliffe or Receiver there for the sd Honor.

Three New Markets granted or Set up not above 3 Miles distant from the said Burrough or Antient Market Towne and three other Markets within Six Miles thereof insomuch as that there is not usually within the said Market within the said Burrough not above Ten Quarters of all manner of Grain in any one Day one time with another And no Market for any manner of Cattle in the whole Year but only at the se Fayre on St James Day, whereas in some of the said New Markets not above 3 Miles thereof it is conceived that there is usually 200 Quarters & sometimes 250 or 300 Quarters of all manner of Graine, and good Store of Cattle there every Market Day.

TO THE THREE & TWENTIETH ARTICLE as to the Setting forth of how many Acres doth a Yard Land contain, and how many Yard Lands do make a Carue or Plow Land and how many Foot go to the Pole or Perche by the Custom of this Honor Wee answer That there is no such Name or Use of a Yard Land within this Mannor now in being, Nor of any Carewes of Land within the Time of Our Memory But Wee hold a plow Land do contain 150 Acres or thereabouts, And that 16 Foot & a half is accounted for a Pole or Perch by the Custom of this Honor But as Wee have heard that the Prince his Highness Lands are accounted here & elsewhere to be 18 Foot to the Pole.

TO THE FOUR & TWENTIETH ARTICLE. We answer. That the Mannor of Maudlins Nothcot Court & Durrante are Parcell & belonging to the Honor of Barkhamsted and a great part of the sd Mannor dismembred as appeareth by severall Presentm^{ts} at divers Courts holden win the said Hallinote whereunto Wee refer Our Selves. And further touching the last part of the said Article Wee have already answered fully in the Answer to the latter part of the Second Article.

TO THE FIRST PART OF THE FIVE AND TWENTIETH ARTICLE Wee answer That Wee know not who holdeth Holcots Mead Turpin's land Aspleys House in the Shoprow or the Land mentioned to be let to farm to Richard Swyfe.

To the Residue of the sa Article touching Hunt's Lands Wee answer first concerning Hunt's Lands in Woodgreen & certain Land called Hunts Land lyeing near the Field called Wood field and other things mentioned in that Article Wee do not certainly know any such Land by these names. But as We conceive by the View of some antient Deeds That some Land called or known by the name of Hunt's Land is lyeing upon a Hill called Hunt's Hill And as Wee conceive is or hath been parcell of the Demeasns of the said Honor and laid into the Park, as appeareth by certain Bounds menconed in the said antient Deeds. But whether the said Land mentioned in the said Deeds be the Land intended by that Article or who holdeth any other part thereof Wee know not neither can Wee conceive except certain Lands containing by Estimation 40 Acres or thereabouts in the Tenure of Rich⁴ Dean lyeing upon the same Hill called Hunt's Hill inclosed from the Park which the said Richard Dean holdeth by Lease from S' Edward Carey Knt by the Yearly Rent of 9 pounds paid to Thomas Murrey Esq' to the use of the Prince his Highness which said 40 Acres now lye in four Closes but as Wee

have been credibly informed by One Henry Field the Elder being about the age of 80 years & of good Credit and also of some others, that 20 acres thereof or there. abouts did lye into the Park about 60 years past and the other 20 acres were then hedged from the Park but yet used by those which yn had the keeping of the Park And at that time one William Field Brother to the said Henry Field did enjoy certain Lands called Cranshawes [Craushawes] Lands and about 9 or 10 Acres now in the Tenure of the said Richard Dean wen did lye between the Heath & the said close of 20 Acres, and as Wee have likewise heard one Hickman did then hold some Land there cont by Estimacon 1 acre next the Heath & some other Land there cont abt 3 Roods now belonging to the Freeschooll of Barkhamsted.

And further concerning the Lands called Preens Wee answer That Wee know not any Lands which were late Walter Preens that paid 8 pence Rent. But we know a Close of Copyhold Land cont by Estim abt 14 acres be it more or less called Great Preen's Field or Prynes [Preens] Land in the Tenure of Roger Turner which payeth the Quit Rent with other Lands mentiond in that Copyhold, And one other Close called little Prynes [Prins] Field con't by Estim 5 Acres & 1 Rood or there abouts which payeth 2 Shillings Rent & Ann. But whether the said Lands are the Lands mentioned in that Article or not Wee know not.

And further concerning the Place called Denn Wee answer, That Wee know not any such place called Denn as is mentioned in the sd Article nor of any Messuage with a Carew or Plowland by that name or of any Land late Pyrrots. But Wee know two places the one called Wessenden & the other called Ottenden. And likewise

divers Places called Deanes in the said Parish of Barkhamsted St Peters & Barkhama St Mary's als Northchurch Viz One called Coopers Dean, One other called Goldsmith's Dean, One other called Bourn Dean, One other called West Dean and one other called Adam's Dean. And Wee know certain Lands called Dean Fields cont about 50 Acres web James Mayn Esq holdeth, upon we there has been no Messuage during the Time of Our Memory, Neither did Wee ever hear of any thereupon till win two years last past the said James Mayn did build a Messuage upon the same, and laid some other Lands thereunto, For those Dean Fields of themselves were heretofore used with other Farm Houses being not of themselves half a plowland, according to the Comon Accompt or Usage within this Honor. But whether those Lands called Dean Fields or any the said Places called Deans or the other before mentioned or any of them are the Lands mentioned in the said Article or not Wee know not.

And further concerning the Lands called Amberleynes Wee have already answered in the Answer to the Tenth Article.

And further concerning the Lands called Gallowaies Wee answer That there is certain Copyhold Lands cont by Estim 38 Acres of arrable Land & Wood called Gallowaies Field whereof Arthur Blunt Gent hath 8 Acres William Edlyn hath 19 Acres and James Shermantyne the Second Son of James Shermantyne deceased hath 11 Acres upon which there hath been a House builded of late years which are more plainly set forth before amongst their Copyhold Lands and to be holden by them.

And further concerning the Meadows called Banck. mill Meadows Wee answer That there be divers Meadows called Banckmill Meads near adjoyning to the Moore, And great Banks where the Mill called Bankmill did stand, whereof Arthur Blunt Gent holdeth one Mead Some time two Meadows cont 5 Acres or thereabouts by Copy of Court Roll Upon which as Wee have heard there hath been a House standing and lyeth upon the South side of the River. Also John How of Little Heath holdeth one little Meadow on the Same Side next the Lane cont by Estim 1 Rood or thereabts by Copy as appeareth more plainly by the Presentments of the Copyhold or Customary lands.

And further concerning the Close called Capps Croft Wee answer That Wee know a Close called Capps Croft cont by Estim 5 Acres be it more or less neer the Tenement of James Mayn Esq[†] and adjoyning to a Parcell of Land of Edmond Young Esqr cont by Estim 2 Acres & 1 or thereabouts towards the South lately laid together in one Close. But whether the same Close of 5 Acres is the Croft mentioned in the said Article or not Wee know not. But the said James Mayne holdeth the said Close called Capps Croft in his own Right, and during all the Time of Our Memory reputed as his own Freehold, and so is for ought Wee know, and is parcell of those Lands for which he payeth yearly to the Prince his Highness 12* 2d for ought Wee know.

And further concerning the 40 Acres mentioned in that Article called Hests Wee answer That there are certain Lands called Hests in the Tenure of the said John How of Little Heath as appeareth likewise in the Setting forth of his Copyhold Land. But whether it be the Land mentioned in that Article or not Wee know not.

And further concerning the Land called Balkeyes Wee answer, That there be divers Lands called Bawkes cont by Estim 3 Acres be it more or less or Balkeves conf by Estim 15 Acres whereof James Mayne Esque holdeth those 3 Acres called Bawkes And Francis Wethered Gent holdeth the other 15 Acres called Balkeves which said severall Parcells are & time out of Memory of Man always reputed Copyhold, and no Parcell of the Demeasnes for ought Wee know.

And further concerning the Garden in Northchurch in the Occupacion of Stephen Royce, it is already presented amongst the Demeasnes. And so likewise Butchers Mead and long Stable Mead.

And further concerning the Field called Leyfield Wee answer, That there is a Field called by the name of Leyfield cont by Estim about 8 Acres lyeing in the Parish of Barkhamsted St Mary's als Northchurch in the Tenure of William Herne the rent thereof 1' 4" payable and paid Time out of Memory of Man unto Francis Barker Gent & others whose Estate he hath as appeareth by some antient Deeds & Presentments at the former Survey in the Terrio' of the Quit Rents due to others.

And further concerning the House called S' Thomas of Acon, Wee answer That there was as Wee have heard a House called St Thomas of Acon. But whether the same were in Barkhamsted St Peter's or Barkhamsted S' Mary's als Northchurch or were any part of that which is come to Edmond Young Esqi or not Wee know not, Nor what Rent is due for the same.

ANSWER.

And further concerning four Acres and one rood called Hests Wee answer That Wee know not who holdeth the same nor whether this Land or any other Land before menconed to be in the Tenure of the said John Howe were the Lands of Jeffery Hests or not We know not.

And lastly concerning all the rest of the parts of the sa five & twentieth Article [being the last Article] Wee answer That Wee have considered & endeavored to the uttermost of Our Powers, and inquired of many aged Persons as well Strangers as Tents inhabiting within or near abt the said Honor but cannot be sufficiently informed whereby to give any further Answer thereunto, nor unto any of the former Articles, neither do Wee See any Likelyhood thereof for that as it Seemeth, That the most part of the [that] last Article, and many of the former Articles are grounded upon an old Record above Three hundred years old. In which Time many Names as well of Men as of their Lands are utterly discontinued and out of knowledg and many Mann's Farmes & other Messuages dismembered and some Messuages increased or new made. And as Wee conceive That Some of the Towns & Places menconed in the sd Article are in Ardingworth weh as Wee are informed is in Northamptonshire and not within the said Parish of Barkhamst St Peter's & Barkhamsted St Marys als Northchurch & others may be in other places or other Countys for aught Wee know, for that there are not any such Names here to Our Knowledg, or that Wee ever heard of.

AND THIS WEE TAKE TO BE A FULL AND PERFECT ANSWER TO ALL THE ARTICLES GIVEN TO US IN CHARGE TO BE INQUIRED UPON FOR THIS PRESENT SERVICE TO THE UTTERMOST OF OUR KNOWLEDGES. YET NEVERTHELESS FOR AVOIDING OF ERROR THAT MAY HAPPEN, EITHER FOR WANT OF JUDGMENT OR TRUE INFORMATION WEE HUMBLY PRAY A FURTHER SUPPLY ADDICON OR REFORMATION OF ANY THING THAT SHALL BE FOUND AMISS UPON FURTHER CON-SIDERATION HAD THEREIN. FOR THAT OUR DESIRE IS TO PRESENT THE TRUTH IN ALL THINGS TO THE UTTERMOST OF OUR KNOWLEDG AND UNDERSTAND-AND IN TESTIMONY THEREOF WEE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS.
