Ashridge We are very happy to share the news of our collaboration with Ashridge House: BLHMS is pleased to report that it has formed a partnership with Hult/EF at Ashridge House. On the 9^{th of} January 2023 we signed a Licence to occupy the first floor of the Adelaide Tower, initially for two years. This provides us with 5 rooms and a kitchen. The latter and the room adjacent to it will become a meeting place for volunteers working here; another room will be established as a scanning centre; the remainder will be used for storing, sorting, and curating material that has been donated to the Society, but which to date has been randomly stored in sheds and lofts, due to the Dacorum Heritage Trust Store being full.

The project will sit comfortably in the Tower, alongside the Ashridge collections which are housed on the floor above.

BLHMS has re-decorated the rooms and will be shortly kitting them out with the necessary storage and office equipment. A sub-committee has been formed to plan this in detail and to draw up the protocol for those wishing to use the facility. Watch this space for further announcements on the launch and how to become involved!

New Publications For the 800th anniversary year (2022) of St Peter's church, Berkhamsted, the Hertfordshire Record Society has published a transcription from the original volume of the accounts held in the British Library. It throws a light on many aspects of parish life in the first half of the seventeenth century.

Berkhamsted St Peter Churchwardens Accounts, c.1584-1660, edited and with an Introduction by Nick Brown assisted by Christine Whittingham
They show the receipts from the more well to do to give to the poor (the late 1620s were a time of real hardship). There are also details of payments for the church administration and building works - the roof, the bells and church furniture, such as the pulpit.
